# Soul man has recipe for relief

*He vows to aid Kenner with new cereal line*

Lloyd Price, the R&B legend who was born in Kenner, is mixing capitalism with philanthropy in his latest venture.

Price, now 74 and living near Manhattan, is a Rock and Roll Hall of Fame member best known for singing such 1950s hits as "Stagger Lee," "Personality" and "Lawdy Miss

Clawdy." He's already got a line of Lawdy Miss Clawdy food products, and now he's starting a Make Momma Proud brand of crunchy granola cereals.

His nephew, a LaPlace resident also named Lloyd Price, told the Kenner City Council on Thursday that he will donate as much as \$5 million from the cereal line to Kenner if sales are as strong as hoped.

"Kenner has always been in his heart," Price's nephew said Friday. "After Katrina, he wanted to formulate a plan to help. The whole aim is to help people recover."

Price later confirmed the

pledge. "It's the right thing to do, no question about it," the singer said.

His nephew did not know specifically how the money from cereal sales will be earmarked but said most of it probably will go to Kenner's nonprofit organizations.

"We have no doubt that once the cereal hits the market, it will sell," the singer's nephew said. "I'm not just plugging it because it's my uncle's product. It's really a great cereal."

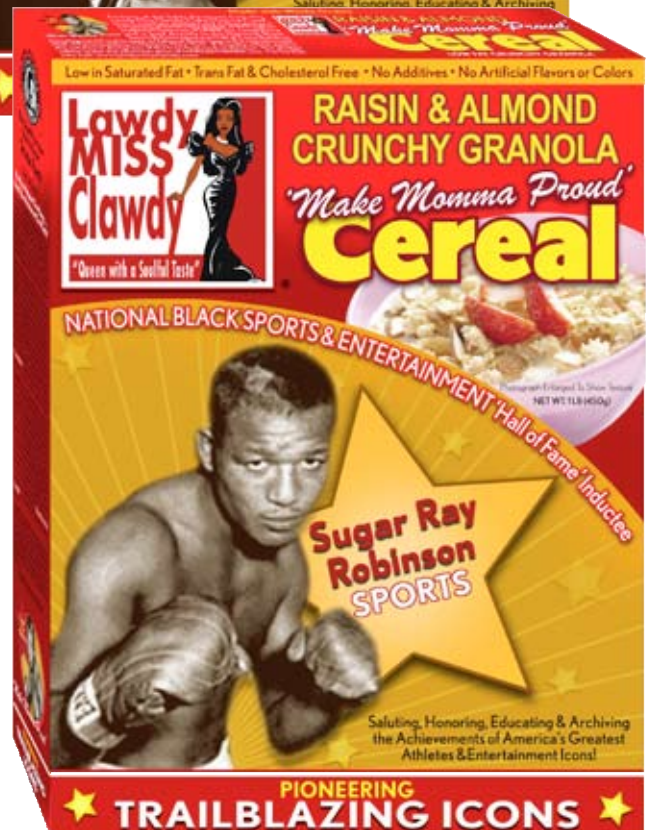
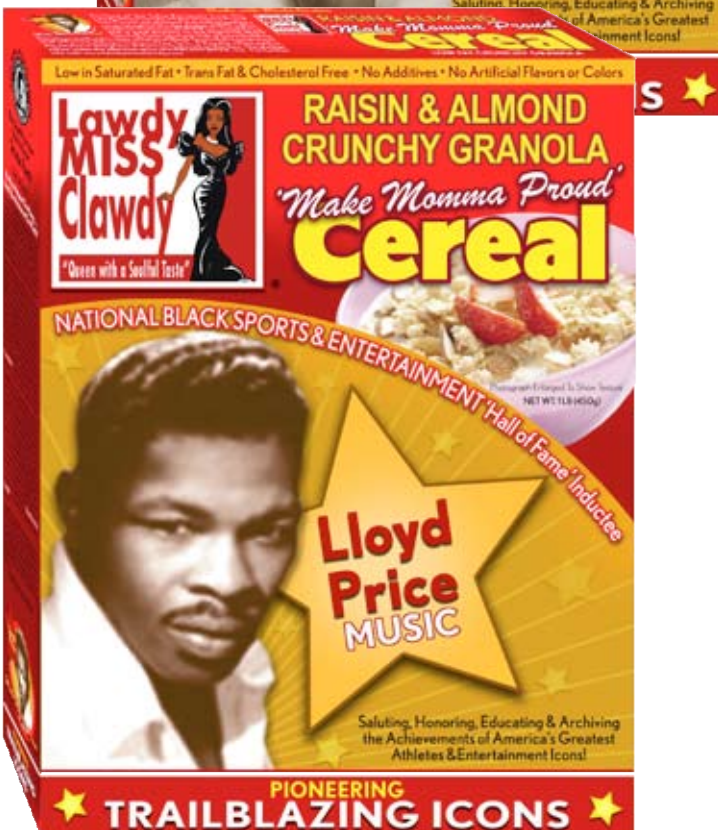
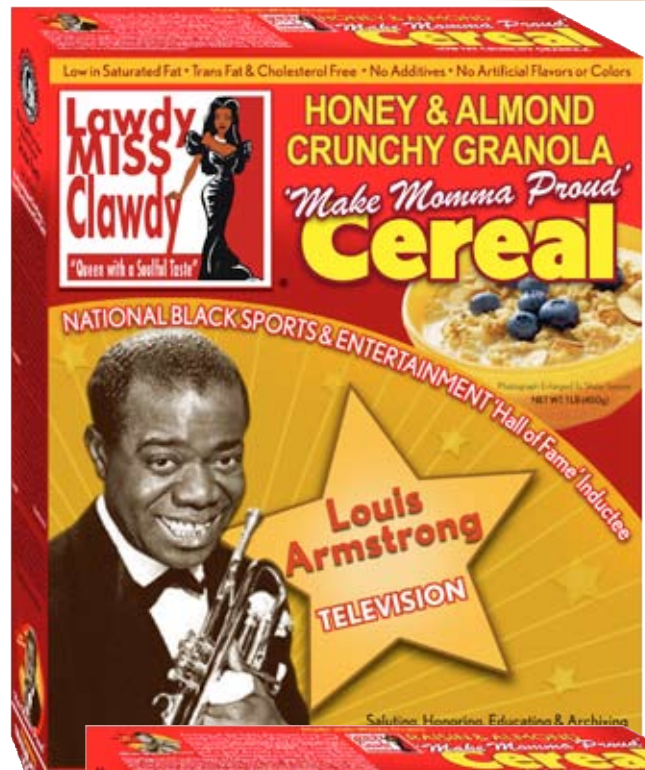
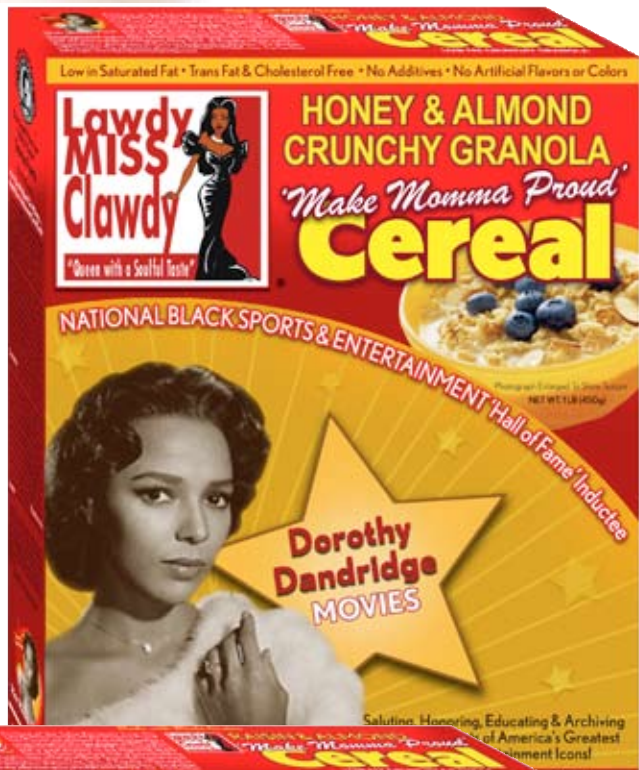
Price said he will hold a press conference Aug. 14 at Tipitina's in New Orleans to announce other philanthropic endeavors.
